Introduction

Should professional athletes make millions to play a sport? Is this fair to the average American worker? Students will write a persuasive essay arguing whether or not the large salary of professional athletes is appropriate.

Learning Objectives

(<u>CCSS.ELA-Literacy.W.9-10.1</u>) Students will write arguments to support claims in an analysis of substantive topics or texts, using valid reasoning and relevant and sufficient evidence.

Materials Needed

- · Computers/laptops
- · Journals/notebooks/paper

Procedure

- 1. On the board, display the following question: Should professional athletes be paid substantial amounts of money to play a sport? Lead an organized discussion on this question and allow several students to share out their thoughts.
- 2. Display this chart of average salaries in America on the board. Ask students the following question: Should professional athletes be paid more than doctors, police officers, military members, etc.? Why or why not? Discuss a few student responses as a class. Ensure that the importance of each career is detailed for the students as well.
- 3. Inform students that they will write a persuasive text in response to that question. They must include at least three supporting paragraphs, an introductory paragraph, and a conclusion. Use the rubric below to grade student work.
